

Job Title: Exhibition & Spatial Design Builder

Job Description

Background: The role of E&SD Builder can be a physically demanding role and requires a flexible approach to work being based primarily within the workshop environment or on-site at venues when required to support the delivery of the Exhibition & Spatial Design projects.

Job Purpose: To support the E&SD Head of Workshop and the E&SD Supervisor/Builder plus the wider team in the preparation and building of Exhibition stands, stage sets and other spatial installation projects ensuring safe transportation to site and return.

Main Duties:

- To undertake workshop duties as required and requested by the E&SD Head of Workshop and the E&SD Supervisor.
- This will include the preparation and building of temporary structures utilising carpentry, painting and finishing skills.
- To organise and prepare kit relevant to each job.
- To liaise with the Spatial Designer and mutually agree and implement the most efficient and effective method of preparing kit.
- To interpret and plan the preparation of items from technical drawings using specialised knowledge.
- To attend morning briefings to determine work schedules and deadlines for the day and week(s) ahead.
- To liaise with the E&SD Head of Workshop and the E&SD Supervisor/Builder and keep them updated with progress.
- To provide backup and support to the team in the workshop as necessary for general day to day tasks.
- To participate in the loading and unloading of vehicles as equipment, exhibition stands and sets leave and return to the workshop.
- To build and de-rig sets on site when necessary to a high standard and to the client's specification.
- To work safely and within Health & Safety regulations at all times and to familiarise yourself with the health and safety policy seeking further training and development if required.
- To support the team by sharing and observing best practice through discussion, training and practical demonstration especially at busy times.
- To cooperate with weekend rotas where necessary and holiday requests thus ensuring the workshop is always covered adequately and not breaching any health and safety regulations.
- To be a proactive team member within Pb engaging professionally with internal staff whilst also acting as an ambassador for Pb externally.
